*Polar extremes or wild coastlines:
exploring the unknown and the intimate*

Through the eyes of Julia Wellner



In the intimate immensity of Svalbard

German photographer Julia Wellner left Geneva to embrace the unknown of Svalbard. Determined to get to grips with this unique territory on the edge of the North Pole, she trained as a guide and now shares the secrets of a world as wild as it is fascinating with PONANT's guests.

"When I arrived in Longyearbyen, I discovered a world apart. For the first three years, I felt like I was learning something new every day. As a child, I used to go and feed the birds in the garden in winter. In Svalbard, humans must not attempt to tame the animals. If they can't find enough to live on, then they can't live there. The same goes for us. You have to be prepared for this climate, which discourages many people, and this also helps to preserve the area.

During the long months of polar night, everything slows down. But the locals go out anyway, illuminated by the glow of the moon, the stars and the Northern Lights... As a photographer, I appreciate more the soft, changing light

of long summer days, when the thick clouds melt into the icy, snowy landscapes, highlighting all the shades of grey, green, white and blue.

People often imagine the North Pole is a silent environment, but that's not so. When we stop talking or moving, we can hear the song of Svalbard in the tinkling of the glaciers, as the air bubbles trapped in the ice are released as it melts. As a guide, one of my missions is to encourage travellers to live the moment, by which I mean, before taking out the camera, it would be good to contemplate and take in this intimate communication with nature. These are the moments that are worth their weight in gold."



Greenland with PONANT

Anatomy of a unicorn

In the Arctic, the elusive narwhal stands out as an exceptional cetacean. In the male, the upper left canine extends into a twisted tusk that can measure three metres. This 'horn' has 10 million nerves endings and its **sensory properties** are unique in the world. The colour of the animal varies according to its age: blue-grey at birth, it becomes black as an adult, before becoming covered in white spots, until it is immaculate white.

The tractors of Hrísey

Nicknamed 'the pearl of Eyjafjörður', the small island of Hrísey lies around 40 kilometres from Akureyri, in the north of **Iceland**. While it is a sanctuary for rare birds such as the rock ptarmigan and the common eider, its originality lies in the colourful tractors that dot the area: most of the 200 inhabitants travel exclusively in these agricultural vehicles.

Newfoundland: half Viking, half Basque

On the northern tip of the island, L'Anse aux Meadows bears witness to the Viking presence in America around the year 1000.

Told in the **Scandinavian sagas**, the existence of a world to the west was probably known to Europeans long before Christopher Columbus took his own ship there. In 1517, Basque sailors, inspired by the Nordic adventurers, settled here to hunt whales and fish for cod in the Labrador Sea.

Once upon a time on Cape Cod...

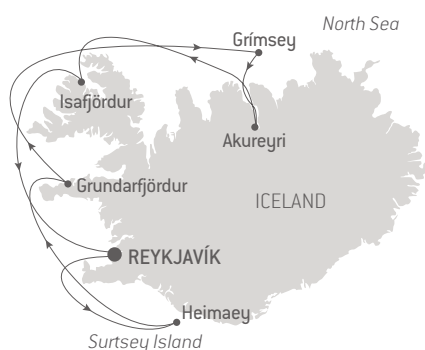

Through the eyes of **Anne-Marie Harrison**



The British archipelagos through the ages

Anne-Marie Harrison has maintained an intimate relationship with the English-speaking world for almost 60 years. Her role as a guide and lecturer specialising in ancient civilisations, coupled with her fascination for Great Britain – the homeland of her husband – puts her in the perfect place to lift the veil for PONANT guests on the mysterious origins of the British archipelagos.

"The British archipelagos comprise around 6,000 islands, of which only 188 are inhabited. Each one, with its own identity, bears witness to a thousand-year-old culture, marked by prehistoric, Celtic, Viking and Anglo-Saxon civilisations. These islands offer a variety of panoramas: the Isles of Scilly, near Cornwall, have a Mediterranean climate and splendid botanical gardens, while the Shetland Islands have very short summer nights, with just a few hours in June. This climatic and geographical diversity reflects a wealth of history and culture.

The Scottish archipelagos date back to the Neolithic period, with megaliths in the Orkney Islands older than Stonehenge. Celtic influences are still present there, notably through local aesthetics and the use of the Gaelic language. The Vikings

left their mark as early as the 8th century, particularly in Shetland, where the motto is still in the Anglo-Scandinavian dialect of Norse, and where their folklore is preserved. They also introduced institutions such as the Tynwald on the Isle of Man, the oldest parliament in the British Isles. In the Hebrides, the sacred island of Iona, a spiritual centre, is a must-see. It was from here that Saint Columba, a disciple of Saint Patrick, set off to evangelise Scotland.

This complex history at the crossroads of many civilisations fascinates European guests, curious about the differences with their neighbours, as well as Anglo-Saxon guests in search of their roots. These cruises turn every port of call into a chance to discover ancestral cultures and breathtaking wilderness."

Long ago, on a cold, dark night, the envious inhabitants of Iceland decided to steal **the Faroe Islands**. The giant and the witch sent on this mission reached the southernmost mountain of the archipelago. The witch tied a rope to it while the giant waited in the sea to drag his precious booty. But the mountain refused to budge. At the first ray of sunlight, both were petrified. Since that day, Risin and Kellingin remain, frozen, gazing melancholically at the ocean and Iceland.

The textile poetry of the San Blas Islands

On rectangular fabrics, naive paintings blend silhouettes of cats, fish, toucans or corals with the fantastic creatures of **local mythology** - pumas, phoenixes, snakes -, in a tangle of lines and patterns. The beauty of these pieces is as much about craftsmanship as it is about enchantment.

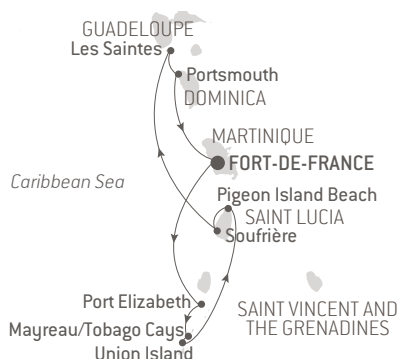

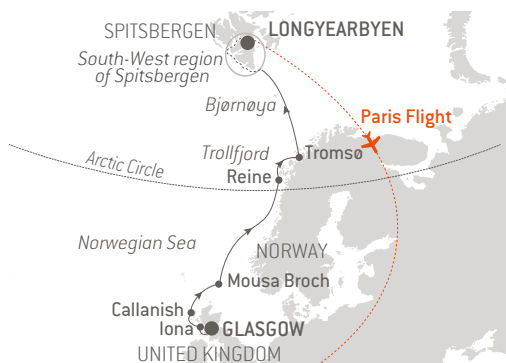

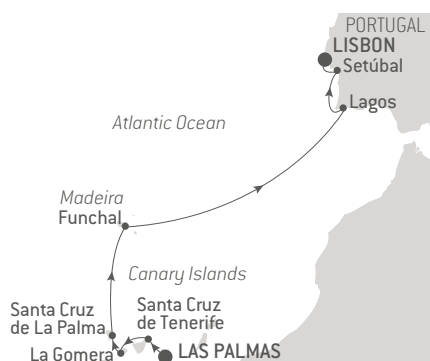

The soul of the sacred islands

Andromache Constantinidou is a qualified Greek guide, cradled by legends and poems about her country passed on to her by her grandmother since childhood. She comes on board PONANT cruises to share these stories and her knowledge. Through her, the gods and myths of Ancient Greece are brought to life, revealing and retracing the shores and history of the West.

"The Greek islands are places touched by grace, and seemingly innumerable; they are scattered across the Aegean and Ionian seas. Inhabited for millennia, they formed the great centres of Greek thought. From the myth of Ulysses to the present day, interest in these islands and their landscapes, unchanged since the dawn of time, has never waned. They embody the true face of Greece and carry evidence of every era. They implore you to explore the heart of these virgin terrains that I sometimes like to describe as orphaned, lost between sky and sea, to those who are about to uncover them for themselves.

In Patmos, where the atmosphere is both gentle yet harsh, visitors are confronted with the powerful words of the Apocalypse, which a curious alchemy combines with sun-scorched landscapes.

Symi, just a few miles off the coast of Asia, is a theatrical setting with polychrome houses set against a barren landscape. In the Cyclades, raised from the sea by the grace of myth and the violence of volcanoes, Paros is nicknamed the 'Marmorean'. The volcanic island of Milos with rounded white rocks smoothed by the sea, offers fascinating lunar landscapes that carry within them the story of Aphrodite, immortalised by the Venus de Milo in the Louvre Museum.

It's no coincidence that the ancient Greeks always worshipped the light. They believed that the gods were intimately linked to these lands. Apollo, who was said to embody light, was born in the heart of the Aegean Sea, on the sacred island of Delos near Mykonos. It is now recognised by NASA as one of the most luminous places in the world. Our islands live in the light: there's no other way to describe them! "

In the footsteps of Papadiamantis

In Skiathos, near the port, the old lime house of Alexandros Papadiamantis has been transformed into a museum. This small building reflects both traditional Greek architecture and the life of its former owner, considered the father of modern Greek literature. Through his collection of antique furniture, books and objects, we can better understand the writings of this unique man who continually told the story of island life, as in his landmark book, written in 1903, *The Murderess*.

Where does mayonnaise come from?

The creation of the famous sauce has given rise to much controversy. So much so that it is hard to distinguish history from legend. The best known identifies the emulsion in **Minorcan cuisine** as early as the 15th century. To celebrate the conquest of Mahon, the island's capital, the Duke of Richelieu is said to have held a banquet and tasted what he called 'mahonnaise'. Much to the displeasure of the Bayonnais who claim paternity from a 'bayonnaise', unfortunately losing the 'b'.

At the tip of the Istrian peninsula, off **Pula**, 14 islets at the water's edge tell a different story of Croatia. They relate the stories of Marshal Tito, who made them his refuge, as well as of Romans and Byzantines, which can be seen in the remains of a temple of Venus or a fortress, and that of James Joyce and Thomas Mann, who both owned a villa here. Time seems to stand still here, surrounded by forests and scrubland, vineyards and olive groves.

Corsica has preserved some of its ingenious stone monuments that date from when it belonged to the Republic of Genoa. These **Genoese towers** were built on promontories along the coastline. Their layout and architecture meant that residents could be informed of an attack in less than two hours and cannon fire could be avoided. Of the 120 towers listed in 1730, 67 still remain today.

Nippon adventures: tropical Japan

Kento Lafay, a Franco-Japanese naturalist guide who grew up in Tokyo, orients PONANT guests as they explore Japan's subtropical islands and discover their unexplored charms. This is a new facet of Japan that is being opened up to travellers, related by a native who is fully immersed in its history, cultures and spectacular landscapes.

"A cruise to the subtropical islands is unlike anything you've ever experienced in Japan. It's a unique experience, because PONANT takes you to them in a different way, sailing to isolated islands that are virtually inaccessible by any other means. These islands are home to many natural treasures, such as the ultra-preserved coral reefs of the Zamami nature reserve, one of my favourite ports of call in the region, in particular for its white sandy beaches. The lush jungles and mangroves of Amami-Ōshima and Iriomote are also striking. Fans of snorkelling and diving can explore the colourful seabed. At Yonaguni, it's not uncommon to swim alongside hammerhead sharks, green turtles and tropical fish similar to those found in Indonesia and Polynesia. Depending on the season, you may even be able to spot whales.

On board, I'm happy to share the rich history of Okinawa. This region was formerly the kingdom of Ryūkyū and was independent until the 19th century. It has developed a unique heritage, influenced by neighbouring countries. Chinese, Thai and Japanese heritage can be found in its dances, architecture, colourful fabrics and cuisine. On the mainland, travellers can enjoy a wide range of experiences and encounters with deeply curious and welcoming locals. Guests are invited to take part in local dances, in a happy and friendly atmosphere, to learn more about karate – born in Okinawa itself – to taste healthy regional specialities that contribute to the longevity of its inhabitants, among other things. As well as enjoying a lush environment, which has earned them the nickname 'Japanese Hawaii', these islands are a call to refocus on what's essential, to slow down and find our balance, our ikigai."

The Zulu epic

Since then, the oldest town in South West Africa has become a thriving fishing port with a unique atmosphere: its colourful colonial buildings, part Imperial German and part Art Nouveau, contrast with the arid landscape and jagged granite rocks that surround them.

Imabari, a 'castle in the sea'

Imabari Castle is a stronghold located on the shores of the **Seto Inland Sea**, on the island of Shikoku. Its history dates back to the great battle of Sekigahara in October 1600. A local lord, Tōdō Takatora, received the plot as a reward and had the first keep built. Surrounded by a moat filled with salt water, Imabari Castle was destroyed and then completely rebuilt, and is one of the archipelago's three *mizujiro*, or 'castles in the sea'.

Curieuse's hundred-year-old tortoises

Curieuse Island in the Seychelles lives up to its name: as you head along the footpaths, you will come across hundred-year-old tortoises wandering around the coconut palms. Also known as the 'elephantine', this native species is the largest in the world and can weigh in at over 300 kg.

The call of Polynesian *Mana*

Former sailor Delphine Poulain set down her sailor's bag in Polynesia 30 years ago, after falling in love with its islands and its inhabitants. A painter, expedition guide and lecturer on board *Le Paul Gauguin*, she confesses her attachment to these lands at the end of the world that she has never left. It also brings her great pleasure to help guests discover the local authenticity that highlights the unparalleled beauty of the landscapes.

"Polynesians are one of the 'water peoples'. Their relationship with the elements, with their environment, with the stars that guided them in their discoveries of the Pacific and with the changing seasons, is extraordinary. They show true respect for nature they have a form of communion with it. I can't give you the definition of mana. I'm not Polynesian. But my feeling, after decades of listening, respecting the traditions of oral transmission, is that the mana is a whole. It is a fusion of the material and immaterial elements that make up its archipelagos: the force of the wind, the sun, the power of the elders, knowledge, stones, trees... The mana reflects great energy. It's a notion that takes on an extremely personal meaning for each person, changing from island to island, and one that is felt in the soul and heart. If there's

one thing that guests tell me as soon as they arrive, it's how immediately they feel enveloped by this energy, so powerful yet so gentle. In Polynesia, there is a natural kindness, an island gentleness that cultivates the art of welcoming and sharing. The reason I decided so quickly to move there was born out of a passion for its history, its customs, its culture and all its arts. And art has played a key role in Polynesian society since time immemorial. Aesthetic appeal can be seen everywhere, from the handmade clothes, to the stamped tapa (bark cloth), through the flowers worn casually in the hair and the shell ornaments. Travelling to these lands is a cultural adventure in its own right, and where above all you appreciate the beauty of human interaction."

Formalities

FOR ALL CRUISES

The information below is current but subject to change at any time without advance notice from government authorities. Please consult your respective government agencies for visa and health information.

Passport valid for at least 6 months beyond the completion of your trip. Passport must contain at least two completely clear, blank, unused visa pages for each visa required, not including any amendment pages. Visa pages with stains or ink from other pages in the passport are not usable. Guests who deviate from the scheduled embarkation or disembarkation

port should research the foreign entry requirements for the port country. Due to government regulations, regrettably, PONANT will have to deny boarding to any guest who fails to obtain the appropriate travel documentation for their trip.

A copy of the visas or travel authorisations requested to the relevant authorities, or of the vaccination certificates for all destinations where they are compulsory, must be sent to PONANT at the very latest **45 days prior to your cruise date**. We also ask you to keep a copy of these documents with your passport throughout the duration of your trip.

(1) **Iceland**: as of 01/01/2024, Iceland reintroduced the tourist tax, newly extended to cruise passengers in response to the social and environmental impact of tourism. This new tax, amounting to ISK 1,000 per stateroom and per night spent on Icelandic territory, will be charged on board at the end of the cruise and paid to the port authorities.

(2) **Greenland**: visas are required for certain countries. See the list on <https://nyidanmark.dk/en-GB/>

(3) Please note that for polar plunge, an EKG (electrocardiogram) by your general practitioner, in addition to the PONANT medical questionnaire, will be required. Also, for persons under 18 wishing to take part in this activity, as well as kayaking, a sworn statement from the parents or legal guardians stating the minor can swim will be required. A parent or legal guardian must be present during the activity.

(4) **Polar diving**: the required level for guests wishing to dive in polar regions is PADI Advanced Open Water or CMAS 2 stars with a dry suit qualification. You also need to demonstrate with your dive log at least 50 dives in cold water, including 20 dives with a dry suit. You will need to provide a certificate of non-indication against the practice of diving. There is no decompression chamber in the polar regions, and diving can be risky. Keep in mind that medical facilities may be several hours, or several days away.

(5) **Canada**: travel by sea: the eTA is not required for US, Australian and British citizens; however, should your flight transit via Canada, you must apply for the eTA before your departure on <http://www.canada.ca/en/index.html>. Other nationalities: a visa may be required, please contact Canada consulate website for details: <https://ircc.canada.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>

(6) **Canada**: entry (or transit) by air: the eTA is required for Australian and British citizens, US citizens are exempt. Other nationalities, please contact Canada consulate website for details: <https://ircc.canada.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>

(7) **United States:** depending on your nationality, an ESTA or visa may be required. Please contact USA consulate website for details. Please note that if you have travelled or lived in countries such as Cuba (on or after 12 January 2021), Iran, Iraq, Sudan, Yemen, Somalia, Libya, Syria or North Korea, the US Department of Homeland Security can deny your ESTA. In this event, you must apply to an embassy for a category B1/B2 visa to travel to the United States. The visa processing time is several months. If you already have an ESTA (valid for 2 years), we ask you to check its status up until the day of departure on the dedicated website.

(8) **Madagascar:** visa issued on board free of charge for stays of less than 15 days in Madagascar. Immunisation against diphtheria-tetanus-polio is recommended. Anti-malaria treatment is highly recommended. Ask your doctor for advice.

(9) **Indonesia:** the visa (US\$35 subject to change) can be obtained at the airport in Bali. We recommend having the exact change as credit cards are not accepted. Depending on your flight arrival time, you might experience some waiting time. More information on <https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id/>

(10) **Papua New Guinea:** visa delivered on board, free of charge.

For yachting cruises, the minimum level required for scuba diving is CMAS 1 star or the PADI Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification

card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented at the beginning of the cruise to our main diving instructor.

For expedition cruises, the minimum level required for scuba diving is CMAS 2 stars or the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented at the beginning of the cruise to our main diving instructor.

For health reasons due to COVID, we strongly recommend that you come on board with your own **mask and snorkel**. As an exception, you will be able to borrow them in accordance with sanitary conditions.
